Residential Trip To Normandy (Summer Term)

As you may already know, the highlight of the Year for the children in Year 6 (apart from their SATs!) is a marvellous week away.

Following a hugely successful residential visit here last year, we have decided to return to Sandown to enjoy an action packed week visiting the Isle of Wight.

Highlights include; a visit to Osborne House, the summer home of Queen Victoria; a fossil walk and museum activities at Dinosaur Isle; a day at Alum Bay and a trip to Carisbrooke Castle. This proved to be both engaging and informative for the children, as well as a fantastic opportunity to celebrate the end of their time at St. Josephs.

Young Mariners Base (Autumn Term)

As part of the PSHE curriculum, the Year 6 children visit the Young Mariners Base in Cheshunt for a morning to undertake a variety activities related to personal safety and healthy living. The event is organised by the Hertfordshire Constabulary and involves a range of scenarios in which the children are asked to consider the risks to themselves/others and the implications of certain types of behaviour.

We have attended this event for several years now and I can honestly say that as well as being a valuable learning experience, the children thoroughly enjoy themselves and derive a great deal of pleasure from the activities undertaken.

In order to enable the trip to take place we usually ask for a voluntary contribution of £1 per child to cover the cost of transport...probably the best £1 you'll spend all year!!

During the Autumn Term the children will also be visiting Kew Gardens to support the Science and English Curriculum.

A further trip to the RAF Museum will take place during the Spring Term to support the History Curriculum.
